<u>Please note that the following list is best considered a work in progress. It should not be quoted without consulting the author.</u>

Based mostly on my own field notes, this brief write-up covers the birds noted by M Campbell, T Ford, J Holmes, I Robinson, A Sun, & myself on a visit to Beidaihe, Hebei, China, after completing the 2011 Oriental Bird Club Fundraiser to NE Tibet.

We recorded 129 species of birds without any undue rushing about. Everything – the ease of the birdwatching, the outstanding food, extremely comfortable accommodations & (not least) the companionship - came together to produce a pleasant & enjoyable short break.

In the species list the concept "bird-days" is used - it is the avian equivalent of man-hours, the day totals added up – it indicates relative abundance but does not consider the "problem" of lingering birds or, important in a non-scientific context such as a birding holiday abroad, how satisfying the encounters were. 25 bird-days for e.g. Spoon-billed Sandpiper could be one distant flock of migrating birds, gone in a flash, or one bird lingering for 25 days, offering the observers point-blank views anytime in that period...

The sequence of the bird list follows *The Howard and Moore Complete Checklist of the Birds of the World* – 3^{rd} *Edition* (Dickinson 2003), in my opinion by far the most useful one-volume checklist to date.

Species List:

Common Pheasant Phasanius colchicus

A singleton at Great Wall on 29th.

Mandarin Duck Aix galericulata

One in flight with other ducks in the evening of 31st.

Falcated Duck Anas falcata

Eight doing laps over the mudflats on 1st.

Mallard Anas platyrhynchos

11 bird-days. Noted on two dates.

Chinese Spotbill Anas zonorhyncha

8+ on 30th.

Garganey Anas querquedula

15 on 1st.

Common Teal Anas crecca

14 bird-days. Noted on three dates.

Little Grebe Tachybaptus ruficollis

Three bird-days. Noted on two dates.

Great Crested Grebe Podiceps cristatus

A single adult on 30th was the only record.

Yellow Bittern Ixobrychus sinensis

Four bird-days. Noted on just two dates.

Black-crowned Night Heron Nycticorax nycticorax

14+ bird-days. Noted on three dates.

Chinese Pond Heron Ardeola bacchus

21 bird-days. Noted on four dates.

Grey Heron Ardea cinerea

49 bird-days. Noted on four dates - main event 29 on the mudflats on 29th.

Purple Heron Ardea purpurea

Four bird-days. Excellent views were had on two dates.

Great Egret Ardea alba

203 bird-days. Noted daily.

Little Egret Egretta garzetta

975+ bird-days. Noted daily.

Dalmatian Pelican Pelecanus crispus

An obliging juvenile on the mudflats on 29th – gone after the high tide...

***Apparently previously unrecorded for Beidaihe.

Great Cormorant Phalacrocorax carbo

29 bird-days. Noted on four dates.

Common Kestrel Falco tinnunculus

One 1st c-y bird over the mudflats on 1st.

Eurasian Hobby Falco subbuteo

20+ bird-days. Noted on three dates - main event 15+ hawking over Great Wall on 29th.

Saker Falco cherrug

One (probably a 2nd c-y) flew S over the mudflats - causing an eruption of gulls and terns - on 28th.

Peregrine Falco peregrinus

A superb 1st c-y drifting about over Great Wall on 29th.

Eastern Marsh Harrier Circus spilonotus

One 1st c-y on 30th.

Pied Harrier Circus melanoleucos

One on 29th & two on 30th – all were 1st c-y.

Common Moorhen Gallinula chloropus

20 on 30th.

Black-winged Stilt Himantopus himantopus

80 bird-days. Noted on three dates.

Pied Avocet Recurvirosta avosetta

37 bird-days. Noted on four dates.

Grev-headed Lapwing Vanellus cinereus

Two were seen well on 30th.

Pacific Golden Plover Pluvialis fulva

Three migr on 31st.

Grey Plover Vanellus squatarola

Nine bird-days. Noted on four dates.

Long-billed Plover Charadrius placidus

Four on 30th – three headed off on migration but one allowed 'scoping at close range...

***Rarely recorded along the coast.

Little Ringed Plover Charadrius dubius

109 bird-days. Noted daily – main event 58 (incl 44 migr) on 31st.

Kentish Plover Charadrius alexandrinus

455+ bird-days. Noted daily.

Lesser Sand Plover Charadrius mongolus

12 bird-days. Noted on four dates.

Greater Sand Plover Charadrius leschenaultii

Singletons were noted on three dates.

Pintail Snipe Gallinago stenura

Ten bird-days. Noted on three dates.

Swinhoe's Snipe Gallinago megala

33 bird-days. Noted on three dates – main event 20 migr (incl no less than ten together at 09h05) on 31st.

***Rarely recorded in such numbers!

Common Snipe Gallinago gallinago

39 bird-days. Noted on four dates.

Eastern Black-tailed Godwit Limosa melanuroides

Three on 30th.

Bar-tailed Godwit Limosa Iapponica

30 bird-days. Noted on four dates - main event 24 (incl 20 migr) on 29th.

Little Whimbrel Numenius minutus

Outstanding views of a grounded singleton on 29th – which then headed off at 06h50...

***In 1996 during a late August Teachers' Special visit "an undoubted highlight of the trip was seeing one of these graceful bird close-up as we were eating breakfast in the grassy dunes on 23rd".

Whimbrel Numenius phaeopus

76 bird-days. Noted daily - main event 36 on 28th.

Eurasian Curlew Numenius arquata

24 bird-days. Noted on three dates.

Far Eastern Curlew Numenius madagascariensis

Nine bird-days. Noted on three dates.

***It was nice to see mixed flocks of curlews...

Spotted Redshank Tringa erythropus

Four bird-days. Noted on three dates.

Marsh Sandpiper Tringa stagnatilis

99 bird-days. Noted on three dates – main event 54 (mainly migr) on 31st.

Common Greenshank Tringa nebularia

112 bird-days. Noted daily – main event 38 migr on 31st.

Green Sandpiper Tringa ochropus

17-18 bird-days. Noted on four dates.

Wood Sandpiper Tringa glareola

43 bird-days. Noted on four dates.

Terek Sandpiper Xenus cinereus

17 bird-days. This charismatic, vocal wader was noted on four dates.

Common Sandpiper Actitis hypoleucos

26 bird-days. Noted daily.

Grey-tailed Tattler Heteroscelus brevipes

58 bird-days. Noted on four dates - memorable views...

Great Knot Calidris tenuirostris

110 bird-days. Noted daily - 'scope views of groups feeding at close range: TINGALING!

Red Knot Calidris canutus

Three bir-days. Noted on just two dates.

Red-necked Stint Calidris ruficollis

355+ bird-days. Noted daily - main event 147 on 1st.

Temminck's Stint Calidris temminckii

A winter-plumaged adult w/ two 1st c-y on 31st was the only record.

Long-toed Stint Calidris subminuta

Seven bird-days. Diligent scanning yielded records on no less than four dates.

Sharp-tailed Sandpiper Calidris acuminata

Five bird-days. Noted on two dates.

Curlew Sandpiper Calidris ferruginea

29 bird-days. Noted on just two dates - main event 28 migr on 31st.

Dunlin Calidris alpina

49 bir-days. Noted on four dates.

Broad-billed Sandpiper Limicola falcinellus

Four bird-days. Noted on three dates.

Oriental Pratincole Glareola maldivarum

Two migr on 31st.

Black-tailed Gull Larus crassirostris

540+ bird-days. this exotic-looking species was noted daily.

'Yellow-legged' Gull Larus (cachinnans) mongolicus

15 bird-days. 1st c-y birds were noted on four dates.

Heuglin's Gull Larus (fuscus) heuglini ssp taimyrensis

Eight bird-days. 1st c-y birds were noted on three dates.

Common Black-headed Gull Larus ridibundus

5,630+ bird-days. Noted daily.

Saunders's Gull Larus saundersi

Possibly the same 1st c-y daily over 28-30th.

Relict Gull Larus relictus

Ten bird-days. Noted on no less than four dates – a group of four 'non-1st winters' on 1st were particularly satisfying, allowing prolonged 'scoping in crisp pre-breakfast light.

Gull-billed Tern Sterna nilotica

Six bird-days. Noted on four dates.

Caspian Tern Sterna caspia

One adult on 29th.

Common Tern Sterna hirundo

1,280+ bird-days. Noted daily – main event 590 on 30th.

Whiskered Tern Chlidonias hybrida

26 on 30th.

White-winged Black Tern Chlidonias leucopterus

318 bird-days. Noted daily - main event 162 migr on 30th.

Oriental Turtle Dove Streptopelia orientalis

18+ bird-days. Noted on three dates.

Eurasian Collared Dove Streptopelia decaocto

Four bird-days. Noted on just two dates.

Spotted Dove Streptopelia chinensis

Three bird-days. Noted on two dates.

Common Cuckoo Cuculus canorus

Good views of three birds on 1st.

Black-capped Kingfisher Halcyon pileata

Eight bird-days. Noted daily - main event four on 29th.

Common Kingfisher Alcedo atthis

Six bird-days. Noted on four dates.

Hoopoe Upupa epops

One on 31st.

Northern Wryneck Jynx torquilla

Two on 1st.

Rufous-bellied Woodpecker Hypopicus hyperythrus

Two were seen well on 1st...

Great Spotted Woodpecker Dendrocopos major

Singletons on both 29th & 1st.

Brown Shrike Lanius cristatus

83 bird-days. Noted on four dates – main event 59 on 1st.

Chinese Grey Shrike Lanius sphenocercus

Superb views of a low key individual on 1st.

Black-naped Oriole Oriolus chinensis

Six bird-days. Noted on three dates – a frame-filler on 29th was especially nice!

Black Drongo Dicrurus macrocercus

Seven bird-days. Noted on two dates.

Red-billed Blue Magpie Urocissa erythrorhyncha

27+ bird-days. Noted on four dates.

Common Magpie Pica pica

Common – not systematically recorded.

Large-billed Crow Corvus macrorhynchos

Heard at Great Wall.

Eastern Great Tit Parus minor

13 bird-days. Noted on three dates.

Yellow-bellied Tit Parus venustulus

An elusive 1st c-v on 30th...

Barn Swallow Hirundo rustica

Small numbers only...

Red-rumped Swallow Cecropis daurica

Small numbers most days...

Fan-tailed Warbler Cisticola juncidis

Six on 30th.

Chinese Bulbul Pycnonotus sinensis

19 bird-days. Noted on three dates.

Pallas's Grasshopper Warbler Locustella certhiola

Two on 30th & one on 1st.

Thick-billed Warbler Phragmaticola aedon

Six bird-days. Noted on just two dates...

Oriental Great Reed Warbler Acrocephalus orientalis

Nine bird-days. Noted on three dates – main event six on 30th.

Black-browed Reed Warbler Acrocephalus bistrigiceps

14 bird-days. Noted on just two dates – main event 13 on 30th... 2-3 of them were downy-headed juveniles.

Dusky Warbler Phylloscopus fuscatus

Two on 1st.

Yellow-browed Warbler Phylloscopus inornatus

11 bird-days. Noted on three dates.

Arctic Warbler *Phylloscopus borealis* Five on 30th & two on 31st...

'Two-barred' Greenish Warbler Phylloscopus trochiloides plumbeitarsus

Singletons were noted on three dates.

Pale-legged Leaf Warbler Phylloscopus tenellipes

Six bird-days. Noted on just two dates.

Eastern Crowned Warbler Phylloscopus coronatus

A singleton showed well on 31st.

Pere David's Laughingthrush Garrulax davidi

11 at Great Wall on 29th.

Vinous-throated Parrotbill Paradoxornis webbianus

8+ bird-days. Noted on four dates.

***Crested Myna Acridotheres cristellatus Feral

Two on 31st.

White-cheeked Starling Sturnus cineraceus

Singletons were noted on two dates.

Chinese Blackbird Turdus mandarinus

One on 29th.

Siberian Blue Robin Luscinia cyane

Two on 1st.

Daurian Redstart Phoenicurus auroreus

Two heard at Great Wall on 29th.

Common Stonechat Saxicola torquatus

15+ bird-days. Noted on three dates.

Eastern Blue Rock Thrush Monticola philippensis

One at Great Wall on 29th.

Sooty Flycatcher Muscicapa sibirica

A superb 1st c-y was 'scoped on 1st.

Asian Brown Flycatcher Muscicapa dauurica

Ten bird-days. Noted on four dates.

***In addition, a couple of unidentified 'brown' flycatchers were logged...

Red-throated Flycatcher Ficedula albicilla

13 bird-days. Noted on just two dates – 12 on 1st was taken as proof that autumn had kicked in...

Eurasian Tree Sparrow Passer montanus

Common – not systematically recorded.

Eastern Yellow Wagtail Motacilla tschutschensis

244+ bird-days. Noted daily.

Grey Wagtail Motacilla cinerea

Four bird-days. Noted on two dates.

White Wagtail Motacilla alba leucopsis

21 bird-days. Noted on three dates.

Richard's Pipit Anthus richardi

15 bird-days. Noted on four dates.

Olive-backed Pipit Anthus hodgsoni

Three on 30th.

Pechora Pipit Anthus gustavi One migr at 06h45 on 31st.

Common Rosefinch Carpodacus erythrinus Four on 29th.

Chinese Grosbeak *Eophona migratoria* Singles were noted on two dates.

Meadow Bunting *Emberiza cioides* Heard at Great Wall on 29th.

***Yellow-breasted Bunting Emberiza aureola 2-3 migr buntings were most likely this species.
