<u>Please note that the following list is best considered a work in progress. It should not be quoted without consulting the author.</u>

Based mostly on my own field notes, this brief write-up covers the birds noted by F Stermitz & myself during a visit to Happy Island. While the island has not remained immune to change since discovered by birders in 1990, developments can scarcely be said to have significantly diminished the island's attractiveness to birds. Situated right on the flyway, its patches of woodland, areas of scrub, 'grassy-reedy flats', shrimp ponds & extensive mudflats (with an easily accessible high tide roost) continue to attract large numbers of migrants in both autumn & spring. If anything, most birdwatchers will now find the island a more attractive holiday destination: accommodation and toilet/shower facilities are much better nowadays, and the infrastructure (access roads & mainland-to-island boat service) is much improved.

Records made on the mainland (at the Great Wall at Shanhaiguan & en route to/from Happy Island from Beidaihe) will be dealt with elsewhere – highlights included Grass Owl *Tyto longimembris*, Chinese Hill Warbler *Rhopophilus pekinensis*, Japanese Marsh Warbler *Locustella (?) pryeri*, Vinous-throated Parrotbill *Paradoxornis webbianus*, Pere David's Laughingthrush *Garrulax davidi*, Bull-headed & Chinese Grey Shrikes *Lanius bucephalus* & *L. sphenocercus* & Red-billed Blue Magpie *Urocissa erythrorhyncha*.

Little Grebe *Tachybaptus ruficollis*One heard on 9th & no less than 32 present in Central Pool on 11th.

Slavonian Grebe *Podiceps auritus*One in Central Pool on 11th.

Great Cormorant Phalacrocorax carbo

650 on 9th, 150 on 10th, 250 on 11th, and 1,520 flying N from roost on 12th.

Black-crowned Night Heron Nycticorax nycticorax

One on 9th.

Little Egret Egretta garzetta

40 heading off on migration at dusk on 11th, and two on 12th. In addition, another flock of 20 unidentified egrets headed off on 11th.

Great Egret E. alba

Six heading off on migration at dusk on 11th.

Grey Heron Ardea cinerea

Four on 9th, two on 10th, 30+ (of which 17 headed off on migration at dusk) on 11th & 2+ on 12th.

Purple Heron A. purpurea

Two seen arriving on 12th.

Eurasian Spoonbill Platalea leucorodia

A flock of 19th landing in the shrimp ponds on 11th.

Ruddy Shelduck Tadorna ferruginea

Three showing well on the mudflats on 11th.

Common Shelduck T. tadorna

300+ on 9th, 75+ on 10th, 430 on 11th & 40 on 12th.

Eurasian Wigeon Anas penelope

12+ on 9th, six on 11th & one on 12th.

Falcated Duck A. falcate

10+ on 0th, 12 on 10th, ten on 11th & eight on 12th.

Gadwall A. strepera

Seven on 12th.

Baikal Teal A. formosa

Three on 9th, 120+ on 11th & 20 on 12th.

Common Teal A. crecca

100+ on 9th, ten on 10th, 30 on 11th & 100 on 12th.

Mallard A. platyrhynchos

100 on 9th, 315 on 10th, 800+ on 11 & 400+ on 12th.

Yellow-nibbed Duck A. zonorhyncha

300+ on 9th, 150+ on 10th, 40 on 11th & 150+ on 12th.

Northern Pintail A. acuta

41 on 9th, 22 on 10th, 50 on 11th & 80 on 12th.

Garganey A. querquedula

One on 12th.

Northern Shoveler A. clypeata

Four on 11th & one on 12th.

Common Pochard Aythya ferina

Two on 11th.

Tufted Duck A. fuligula

One on 11+12th.

Eastern Marsh Harrier Circus (aeruginosus) spilonotus

Three on 10+11th & seven on 12th. Some long-stayers were involved, and all but two were definite 1st c-y birds.

Hen Harrier C. cyaneus

Three on 9th, two on 10+11+12th. Except for an adult female on 9+10th all were 1st c-y, including one arriving in off the sea over the jetty as we were leaving...

Northern Goshawk Accipiter gentilis

Singles on 9+10th & two on 11th.

Japanese Sparrowhawk A. gularis

Singles on 9+11th & two on 10+12th.

Eurasian Sparrowhawk *A. nisus* Two on 9+12th & three on 10+11th.

Common Buzzard Buteo buteo japonicus

Singles on 9+10th, two on 11th & six on 12th.

Osprey Pandion haliaetus

One 1st c-v on 12th.

Eurasian Kestrel Falco tinnunculus

Two daily over 9-12th.

Amur Falcon F. amurensis

Three on 10th, four on 11th & 14 on 12th.

Peregrine F. peregrinus

One on 9th & two on 10+11+12th. A minimum of three individuals were involved, with just one clearly passing through: an adult at 07h56 on 12th.

Japanese Quail Coturnix japonica

One on 9th, 3+ on 10th & three on 11th.

Common Crane *Grus grus*

Most likely the same individual with Red-crowneds on 10+11th.

Red-crowned Crane G. japonensis

Six (of which two were adults and two juveniles) on 10th & seven on 11th.

Common Oystercatcher Haematopus ostralegus Two on 10th & 16 on 11th.

Kentish Plover Charadrius alexandrinus

200+ on 10th, 500+ on 11th & one on 12th.

Lesser Sand Plover C. mongolus

One on 10th.

Pacific Golden Plover Pluvialis fulva

One heard on 11th.

Grey Plover P. squatarola
One on 10th, 150+ on 11th & 1+ on 12th.

Northern Lapwing Vanellus vanellus

Eight migr on 12th.

Dunlin Calidris alpina

15 on 10th & 500+ on 11th.

Common Snipe Gallinago gallinago Three on 10th & one on 11th.

Eurasian Woodcock Scolopax rusticola

One in Temple Wood on 9th.

Bar-tailed Godwit Limosa lapponica

Two on 10th.

Eurasian Curlew *Numenius arquata* 75 on 10th, 550 on 11th & ten on 12th.

Far Eastern Curlew *N. madagascariensis*One on 10th, eight on 11th & three on 12th.

Spotted Redshank Tringa erythropus

Singles on 9+11th.

Marsh Sandpiper *T. stagnatilis* One on 9th & 25 on 11th.

Common Greenshank T. nebularia

Two on 9th. ten on 10th, 240 on 11th & six on 12th.

Terek Sandpiper Xenus cinereus

Two obliging individuals on 10th.

Relict Gull Larus relictus

One 1st c-y on 11th - "dropped in on flats in front of us rather briefly", but was seen well &

Saunders's Gull L. saundersi

Three (two adults & one 1st c-y) on 10th & one adult on 11th.

Black-headed Gull L. ridibundus

10+ on 9th, c200 flying to roost on 11th & five on 12th.

Black-tailed Gull L. crassirostris

One on 9th, two on 10+12th & ten on 11th.

Yellow-legged Gull L. cachinnans mongolicus

Two 1st c-y birds on 11th.

Heuglin's Gull L. heuglini taimyrensis

Single 1st c-y birds on 10+11th.

Gull-billed Tern Sterna nilotica

Four showing well, dropping on the mudflats in front of us to pick up prey items, on 11th.

Caspian Tern S. caspia

Three on 9th & four on 11+12th.

Oriental Turtle Dove Streptopelia orientalis Six on 9th, five on 10th, 15 on 11th & 11 on 12th.

Hoopoe Upupa epops

One on 9th, five on 10th & three on 11+12th.

Asian Short-toed Lark Calandrella (rufescens) cheleensis

Five – of which four migr – on 10th.

Eurasian Skylark Alauda arvensis

c40-50 daily over 10-12th.

Barn Swallow Hirundo rustica

c50 daily over 9-12th.

Red-rumped Swallow H. daurica

Two on 10th & one on 11th.

Richard's Pipit Anthus richardi

One on 9th, six on 10th, seven on 11th & nine on 12th.

Olive-backed Pipit A. hodgsoni

One on 9th, 14 on 10th, ten on 11th & 17 on 12th.

Red-throated Pipit A. cervinus

Two on 10th, three (of which one was flying to roost late in the afternoon) on 11th & four on 12th.

Water Pipit A. spinoletta

One on 10th.

Buff-bellied Pipit A. rubescens

44 on 9th, 39 on 10th, 73 (of which 51 were flying to roost late in the afternoon) & 23 on 12th.

Yellow Wagtail Motacilla flava

Four on 9th, eight on 10th & three on 11th.

Citrine Wagtail M. citreola

One fly-by male on 11th.

Grey Wagtail M. cinerea

One on 11th.

White Wagtail M. alba

Four on 9th, seven on 10th, six on 11th & 19 on 12th.

Ashy Minivet Pericrocotus divaricatus

Singles on 9+10th & two on 12th.

Chinese Bulbul Pycnonotus sinensis

Five on 9th, 32 on 10th, 10+ on 11th & 28 on 12th.

Siberian Accentor Prunella montanella

Two on 11+12th.

Rufous-tailed Robin Luscinia sibilans

One on 11th.

Siberian Rubythroat L. calliope

Singles on 11+12th.

Siberian Bluetail Tarsiger cyanurus

14 on 9th, five on 10th, 20 on 11th & 11 on 12th.

Daurian Redstart Phoenicurus auroreus

Three on 9+11th & eight on 12th.

Stonechat Saxicola torquata stejnegeri

Two on 10th & singles on 11+12th.

White's Thrush Zoothera dauma

Probably the same individual on 11+12th.

Grey-backed Thrush Turdus hortulorum

Three on 12th.

Naumann's Thrush T. naumanni

One on 9th, nine on 10th, eight on 11th & eight (including the only ssp *naumanni* identified) on 12th

"Dark"-throated Thrush T. ruficollis ruficollis

Two on 9th, ten on 11th & three on 12th. In addition, a possible atrogularis was seen in flight on 12th.

Fan-tailed Warbler Cisticola juncidis

One on 10th & two on 11+12th.

Black-browed Reed Warbler *Acrocephalus bistrigiceps* Two on 9+10+12th & one on 11th.

Oriental Great Reed Warbler A. orientalis

One heard on 12th.

Claudia's Leaf Warbler Phylloscopus (reguloides) claudiae

One on 11th.

Greenish Warbler P. trochiloides plumbeitarsus

One heard briefly on 12th.

Pallas's Leaf Warbler P. proregulus

Nine on 9th, three on 10th, 65+ on 11th & 28 on 12th.

Chinese Leaf Warbler P. yunnanensis

Probably the same individual heard on 10+11th.

Yellow-browed Warbler P. inornatus

Two on 9th, one on 10th, three on 11th & eight on 12th.

Radde's Warbler P. schwarzi

Three on 9th & two on 11th.

Dusky Warbler P. fuscatus

Two on 9th, four on 10th & six on 11+12th.

Yellow-bellied Tit Parus venustulus

One heard on 9th & 15 (incl 11 flying SE over the huts before sunrise; the other four were in West Wood later in the morning, yielding excellent views) on 12th.

Penduline Tit Remiz pendulinus consobrinus

40 on 9th, 175 on 10th, 65 on 11th & 925+ on 12th.

Chestnut-flanked White-eye Zosterops erythropleurus

Six on 10th, 20 on 11th & 12 on 12th.

Common Magpie Pica pica

Three on 9th, 21 heading off at 07h45 (at least a couple returned later!) & eight heading off on 12th.

Rook Corvus frugilegus

Four migr on 12th.

White-cheeked Starling Sturnus cineraceus

Nine on 9th, 15 on 10th, 23 on 11th & 260+ on 12th.

Tree Sparrow Passer montanus

20-50+ daily. No obvious influx or departure noted.

Brambling *Fringilla montifringilla* Two on 11th & 18 on 12th.

Common Rosefinch Carpodacus erythrinus

One on 10th, four on 11th & five on 12th.

Black-faced Bunting Emberiza spodocephala

15 on 9th, 40 on 10th & ten on 11+12th.

Yellowhammer E. citrinella

A female/juvenile-type bird seen briefly on 10th.

***Perhaps only the 2nd record for the Hebei coast.

Pine Bunting *E. leucocephalos* Two on 11th & one on 12th.

Chestnut-eared Bunting E. fucata

Three on 10th & one (an adult perching obligingly on the Onion Patch fence) on 12th.

Yellow-throated Bunting E. elegans

Two on 11th & four on 12th.

Yellow-browed Bunting E. chrysophrys

One on 11th.

Tristram's Bunting *E. tristrami*

One (coming down to drink) on 9th & two on 11th.

Rustic Bunting E. rustica 49 on 11th & ten on 12th.

Little Bunting E. pusilla

Four on 10th, 11 on 11th & ten on 12th.

Chestnut Bunting *E. rutila* Two on 11th & six on 12th.

Common Reed Bunting *E. schoeniclus minor* One on 10th & two on 12th.

Pallas's Reed Bunting *E. pallasi*Ten on 9th, six on 10th, 26 on 11th & 38 on 12th.

Japanese Reed Bunting *E. yessoensis* One on 10th, three on 11th & two on 12th.
